4) All Non-JUPAS students who have obtained HKDSE Level 4 or above are also required to submit the application for course exemption of LUE1001 via their major Department/Programme for endorsement and forward it to the Registry for further processing.

Under the revamped English Language Enhancement (ELE) programme, students will be grouped under two streams. Group A students are those who obtained level 3 in HKDSE English or equivalent while Group B students are those who obtained level 4 or above in HKDSE English or equivalent. Students are encouraged to take their first required ELE course, viz. LUE1001 for Group A and LUE1002 for Group B, in First Term of Year 1. However, they are given the flexibility to take the respective courses in Second Term of Year 1. For Group A students who take LUE1001 in Second Term of Year 1, they should take LUE1002 in First Term of Year 2. General

1. Regulation 2(1) of the Immigration Regulations (Chapter 115A), Laws of Hong Kong, stipulates that permission given to a person to land in Hong Kong as a visitor shall be subject to the following conditions of stay:
 - (a) he shall not take any employment, whether paid or unpaid;
 - (b) he shall not establish or join in any business; and
 - (c) he shall not become a student at a school, university or other educational institution.
2. Any person who contravenes a condition of stay in force in respect of him shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a maximum fine of HK\$50,000 and to imprisonment for 2 years under section 41 of the Immigration Ordinance (Chapter 115), Laws of Hong Kong.

Permissible Activities for Visitors

概述

根據香港法例《入境規例》（第115A章）第2(1)條的規定，給予某人以訪客身分在香港入境的准許，須受下述逗留條件規限：

該人不得接受有薪或無薪的僱傭工作；

該人不得開辦或參與任何業務；及

該人不得就讀於學校、大學或其他教育機構。

根據香港法例《入境條例》（第115章）第41條，任何人違反對他有效的逗留條件，即屬犯罪，經定罪後，最高可判罰款港幣五萬元及監禁兩年。
