Minor in Environmental Studies

Rapidly degrading ecological conditions in Mainland China, Hong Kong and elsewhere require the attention and understanding of citizens, businesses and policy makers. The Environmental Studies Minor is designed to give students grounding in the human dimensions of environmental change, thus enabling them to make informed decisions about their personal behaviour and public policies related to the environment.

The Minor in Environmental Studies focuses on the social dimensions of the natural environment, including cross-disciplinary environmental policies, environmental politics, environmental economics, environmental ethics, and environmental values. Students who complete this Minor will have valuable credentials that will make them valuable assets to a wide range of businesses and organisations.

The Office of the Faculty of Social Sciences coordinates the Environmental Studies Minor.

All undergraduate students are welcome to pursue the Minor in Environmental Studies.
