

Minor in Cinema Studies

The Minor in Cinema Studies is housed under and administered by the Department of Digital Arts and Creative Industries.

Programme Aim:

Students enrolled in the Cinema Studies Minor will gain an understanding of film as an art form and as social practice, the relations between cinema and other arts, and the international dimensions of the medium.

Intended Learning Outcomes of the Minor:

1. To develop a basic awareness and appreciation of film as a modern medium of communication and creativity
2. To read and interpret film images and narratives reflected in a wide range of cinematic works, styles, and movements
3. To understand film's significance as a means of social, cultural, ideological, and/or political expression used for both popular entertainment and social change

For students from the 2020-21 intake and onwards

Programme Details:

Students whose Major is in any programmes other than BA (Hons) Film and Visual Arts/ Visual Studies and BA (Hons) Film and Media Studies may qualify for a Minor in Cinema Studies after successful completion of five courses in the Film Art Course List, resulting in a total of 15 credits.

Programme Details:

1. Students whose Major is in any programmes other than BA (Hons) Film and Visual Arts/ Visual Studies and BA (Hons) Film and Media Studies may qualify for a Minor in Cinema Studies after successful completion of a required course and four other electives, resulting in a total of 15 credits.
2. The required course must be completed with a grade of C- or above before the student can declare the Minor.
