Brief Course Description

Aims

This course provides an opportunity for students to study and discuss selected topics in history.

Learning Outcomes

Will be specified for each topic as the syllabus is developed.

Indicative Content

The intent of this course is to allow flexibility in that the specific topic may be selected according to the interests of the students, faculty availability, and/or developments which are taking place in the world.

Teaching Method

As appropriate for the specific topic being offered.

Measurement of Learning Outcomes

Will be specified for each topic as the syllabus is developed.

Assessment

Assessment will be determined by the nature of the topic chosen.

Required Readings

Will be provided to students to match the content of the course.

Important Notes:

- (1) Students are expected to spend a total of 9 hours (i.e. 3 hours of class contact and 6 hours of personal study) per week to achieve the course learning outcomes.
