OSL has worked extensively with local and overseas partners such as MIT¹, Stanford University², and HKUST to further strengthen the Service-Learning programme at Lingnan University. Under the current COVID-19 situation, many international partnerships are put on hold, and are at risk of being delayed until social distancing and international travel measurements are lifted. In order to continue expanding on these relations and offer LU students an opportunity to learn within an international context and strengthen engagement through continued experiential learning, this project intends to produce videos for blended-learning participatory design workshops in collaboration with MIT D-lab and HKUST. These videos be used in LU courses related to community engagement in a broad sense, which will be implemented first in CLA9021 and SLP1101.

Participatory design is based on students' interdisciplinary engagement with communities through a problem-solving process³ and involves cooperation between students and community members. The videos for this project will give students a step-by-step guideline on how to go through this problem-solving process. By including self-directed experiential learning exercises (for example, conducting an interview with community member), they will allow students to create meaningful community engagement even in the event of continued online-only teaching mode or will be used for blended learning if the situation permits. Experiential learning is an effective way for engaging students in their learning process⁴, and can be incorporated into online learning with the proper tools.⁵ In order to strengthen teaching and learning knowledge transfer, the project will include a workshop on participatory design in the classroom provided by (an) external expert(s) for OSL staff and faculty members.
